Debris Removal on Non-State Maintained Roads

October 19, 2018

5:15 p.m.

Carteret County, NC – Carteret County secured a contractor to remove disaster debris on non-state maintained roads within the unincorporated areas of the County. The County's contractor is scheduled to begin removing debris from the right of way this Sunday, October 21, 2018. NCDOT through their contractor continues their first pass of debris removal from the right-of-way of state maintained roadways.

Citizens must separate disaster debris by vegetative or C&D, and place it curbside; without blocking the roadway. As a reminder, regular household trash and bagged debris of any kind will not be picked up with disaster debris.

To date, Carteret County has received in excess of 750,000 cubic yards of debris at the 8 temporary debris sites the County operates. The County sites continue to receive debris from citizens, towns, and NCDOT contractors.
